

Six Reasons You Need a Virtual Classroom Producer

Handouts. You can send the handouts in advance or make them available on the webinar for download or both. But there will always be those participants that can't figure out how to get the materials being used in the class. Your virtual classroom producer can take care of those participants without any interruption to class.

Internet Problems. Have you been on a webinar or web meeting that suddenly ended because the host's internet failed? A virtual classroom producer can share hosting privileges with your facilitator, serving as a technical backup in case of internet issues. The facilitator can continue by phone if necessary while the producer keeps the slides on screen and the meeting running.

Follow Up. A virtual classroom producer can take over the end of session tasks such as evaluations, submitting attendance records to the LMS administrator, and sending follow up emails or other materials.
